As we conclude 2007 and look to a new year, I thank you for your community pride and continued support of our wonderful town.

Several significant events took place this past year:

After forty plus years the town has taken over ownership and management of Broadway Community Park. I highly commend the many individuals whose vision created the park and hundreds of volunteers who over the years gave of their time and talents to keep it running. The park is a beautiful facility we have enjoyed and the town will work hard to make it even better.

The Streetscape Phase 1 project was recently completed after many years of planning. While the project was completed quickly, the mess and barricades was inconvenient at times. Some of you have expressed your disappointment in various features of the project. Some of you have expressed your pleasure. Your feedback, positive or negative, is important to me and I respect your opinions even when we disagree. I continue to believe the finished project will be a long-term positive asset to our town and hope you will to.

After months of work by our town manager, legal council and town council, the town has purchased at auction the North Fork Reclamation Facility east of Timberville. What started out as a frivolous lawsuit against us by the facility's owner, led to an opportunity for us to purchase, upgrade and operate the facility. Not only has Broadway secured the future availability of waste treatment for the town and its three customers but has the possibility of offering service to additional customers. This is a huge and exciting undertaking for us and brings to the town an asset whose value is much greater than its cost. I commend Kyle O'Brien for his skill and many months of long hours preparing us to purchase and now operate the facility.

I hope 2007 was kind to you and your family. May 2008 offer you new opportunities, good health and success. As always, I thank you for your comments, advice and continued support.

Manager's Memo

As we move into the New Year, we will be welcoming several new employees to the Town's staff. John Coffman was recently hired to head up the wastewater facility. John has extensive experience in the wastewater industry and is currently employed at the Pilgrim's

Pride Broadway complex as their wastewater manager. John's start date is January 7, and he will be complimented at the facility by two former SIL employees, Ray Mohler and Lee Greico, with each having served at the facility for the last several years.

We've also recently hired Charles Smith as our water plant superintendent. Charles brings over 30 years of water treatment experience, and was most recently employed by the Town of Bridgewater in a similar capacity. Charles starts work with the town on January 2nd and will be replacing Ross Clem who will be moving into semi-retirement at the end of January. We will still continue to utilize Ross's expertise however, as he is staying on in a part time role to assist with our ongoing projects.

Finally, we've hit the ground running on the operation of the former SIL facility. Our revenue contracts are locked in with the facility's three customers for the next 18 years, engineering is well underway and we feel extremely good about the future operation of the facility and its importance to the Town. We have an outstanding consent decree that was negotiated through the DEQ and the Attorney General's office that spells out interim limits while the improvements are underway, which provides the Town a level of protection until the ultimate compliance date.

BUSINESS LICENSES

Business licenses for the calendar year January 1, 2008 – December 31, 2008 are on sale now at the Town Office. Renewal applications are being mailed to all businesses, which have obtained licenses during the past year, and new licenses must be secured no later than March 1, 2008 to avoid penalty. If you have any questions concerning a business license or how to calculate the fee, please call the Town Office.



AUTOMOBILE DECAL SALES

Current Town of Broadway automobile decals will expire on April 15, 2008. New automobile decals will go on sale at the Broadway Town Office beginning March 1, 2008 and must be displayed on all vehicles by April 15th. Preprinted application forms will be mailed, and in the event that you do not receive one, blank forms for your completion are available at the Town Office. We encourage everyone to bring or mail the preprinted or a completed form when making decal purchases. This will provide all of the information required for decal purchase and greatly assists Town Staff in the issuance of decals. If, for some reason, you are unable to provide the form, you must present your registration card and social security number at the time of purchase. In addition to the above, all Personal Property Taxes, plus penalty and applicable interest, must be paid prior to issuance of decals. Please feel free to drop off your completed form with the correct payment in the Town's drop box located at the back of the Town Office and your decal will be mailed to you.

BROADWAY EMERGENCY SQUAD NEWS

The members of the Broadway Emergency Squad hope that you and your families had a very safe and joyful holiday season. Winter means snow and ice, and we would ask that you remember several safety issues. Please be sure to buckle up and slow down when the road conditions are hazardous, allowing a few extra minutes can save a life. Also, please be sure to have your house number clearly visible from the roadway so that precious moments are not lost as we try and find the emergency. Finally, keeping sidewalks and driveways clear of winter precipitation makes for safer conditions for everyone.

As we head into 2008, we would like to share with you some statistics from this past year for you to consider as you are making donations. As of December 1, 2007 the members of the Broadway Emergency Squad ran 1,631 calls (medical illness, fire, traffic crashes, public assistance, etc.) resulting in 59,469 miles on our ambulances. Volunteers with the Squad ran 2011 calls, and if you consider that the average call lasts 1 1/2 to 2 hours, that is between 3000-4000 man hours given to this community throughout the year. We are extremely fortunate to have the support of the Rockingham County Fire and Rescue Department in answering these calls for service, but in the end it is donations and volunteer hours that keep our station open.
